Cornerstone Family,

I don't know if you can feel it, but we are moving into Part Two of the Cornerstone story. Part One was about planting seedlings of a new congregation in the soil of Tulsa, doing our part to water and feed them and trust that God in his kindness would cause his face to shine on them and make them grow. Part One was about the start of new friendships, the rekindling of old faith, the awakening of atrophied muscles for ministry and relearning to extend hospitality in Jesus' name. Part One included our time worshiping in the space on Lewis and the announcement of our transition into the Anglican Church. It included our transition to the old Freeman-Harris Funeral Home and the rapid and unforeseen growth of our congregation.

In October, we announced our intent to purchase and renovate our current building, and purchase the former Church of Christ building at 10th & Rockford for a future church plant. As of today, we have closed on both of those properties. And now, after a lot of diligent work by a lot of people, I am able to update you more fully on our plans moving forward and ask for your prayer and faith-filled partnership to help enact them.

By God's grace, Part Two of the Cornerstone story will be characterized by the continuation and maturing of the values we established in Part One. One new way this will be expressed in the next season as a church is our formal designation by Bishop Todd Hunter as a "Resource Church" for the Diocese of Churches for the Sake of Others (C4SO).

In the pages that follow, you'll get to see some of the detailed plans that are in motion to renovate our current space to serve our long-term needs, our plans for the Rockford space, a timeline for all of this, and the fundraising goals to pull it off.

May "the God who gives endurance and encouragement give [us] a spirit of unity among ourselves as we follow Christ" (Rom. 15:5) and as we do our part to cultivate communities shaped by the gospel for the renewal of all things.

Dear Cornerstone Church Tulsa,




THROUGH THESE RENOVATIONS, WE WILL:

- Improve sanctuary seating capacity while maintaining intimacy
- Enhance sacred nature of sanctuary (kneelers, sound improvements, creation of prayer room)
- Solve bathroom deficiency and expand lobby
- Increase number of kids classrooms and improve security
- Improve "family room" for crawlers and active kids during service
- Create a dedicated space for Cornerstone Students

- Establish permanent office space for staff (currently off-site)
- Make several new green spaces (rooftop, playground)
- Maximize ability to host weddings and funerals
- Gain parking spaces with reconfiguration of lot
- Establish 41st & Harvard space as "hub" for mission in Tulsa area





ROCKFORD IMPROVEMENT

For over 100 years, believers have been gathering in the neighborhood around the former 10th & Rockford Church of Christ site to worship, to reflect on the Scriptures, to receive Holy Communion and to be sent out into the world. We want to continue that holy work through the launch of a new Cornerstone congregation. We believe the Pearl District, sitting right next to Historic Route 66 is poised for a significant renaissance. We envision a vibrant, faithful, orthodox and missional church right in the heart of the action. With its proximity to downtown Tulsa, an influx of new housing (including >50 new studio apartments opening next door), and a historically socio-economically diverse population, we believe this to be a strategic neighborhood to plant an outpost of the Kingdom of God.

In preparation to activate this facility and make it operational, however, there are a number of improvements we need to make:

- Update Children's Classrooms
- Sanctuary upgrades
- New roof
- Security upgrades
- Adding children's bathroom

- Install fire monitoring system
- Updating lobby
- Restriping parking lot
- Updating front entrance
- Other deferred maintenance



PROJECTED COST

Harvard Renovations: \$6.9m Rockford Renovations: \$500,000 Other Costs (FFE, Residency Startup, Project Margin): \$1m

TOTAL PROJECT COSTS: \$8.4M

Cash Available from Past Gifts/Savings: \$3.4m MINIMUM AMOUNT NEEDED TO RAISE: \$5M

Raising \$5m will pay for the physical changes to our Rockford and Harvard properties and will be a great step toward living into our future together! We believe God has postured us to reach this goal together.

After renovations, we will still owe \$2.3m on Harvard and \$1.4m on Rockford. Payments on these mortgages represent about \$350,000 in our annual operating budget. Every dollar given in excess of the \$5m goal will help eliminate debt and free up more resources for mission and ministry!

We believe that God is able to do more than we can ask or imagine, and we want to work together toward being debt-free and dreaming about our future.

AMOUNT NEED TO FUND PROJECT AND ELIMINATE DEBT: \$9M

Accelerating the elimination of the debt will position us to plan for future church plants. This is especially important as we develop a pipeline of future church planters and collaborate with C4SO as a Resource Church.

CREATIVE STRATEGIES FOR GIVING

There is a role in this campaign for every person who calls Cornerstone their home church. Every single contribution enables our success.

You will not be pressured or told what you should give, but rather encouraged to pray to discern God's will for your giving.

We won't give equal amounts, but we are equally invited into prayerful and sacrificial generosity, whatever that means for each of us.

A few things to consider as you pray about how to give:

1. REMEMBER THAT SMALL GIFTS ADD UP

By giving smaller amounts at higher frequencies—weekly, semi-monthly, or monthly—large gifts can be reached in smaller steps. Setting up automated giving can make small gifts part of your regular routine.

2. REVISIT YOUR BUDGET

Intentional lifestyle adjustments can free up resources to give, and may help achieve other goals. Examples include canceling streaming subscriptions, limiting meals or coffee out, and generally assessing wants and needs.

More substantial gifts may come from bigger family sacrifices, such as:

- Postponing major expenditures such as cars, home projects or trips.
- Carving out a portion of commission income, bonuses or raises.
- Redirecting other income from interest, dividends, rental properties.

3. INCLUDE YOUR KIDS AND STUDENTS

Adults are not the only ones who are interested in or who will benefit from this project. This is a great opportunity to teach our kids about honoring the Lord through a habit of sacrificial generosity. Whether it comes in the form of a special Cornerstone Piggy Bank, a Lemonade stand in the cul-de-sac, or just participating in a family meeting about giving, we encourage you to engage your kids in this campaign. We would love for our kids and students to feel like they have a meaningful part to play in fulfilling our mission together.

4. MAKE GIVING A HABIT

For those who have never made giving to the Lord through the church a habit, use this opportunity to get started! The idea of tithing may feel like an unattainable goal, so start small. Commit to giving a smaller percentage of your income, and increase it gradually on an annual basis. This will help ease you into the habit. As the church is taking on this big financial commitment, we will need the renewed strength that comes from first-time givers securing our normal operating income.

5. CONSIDER GIFTS OTHER THAN CASH

Gifts other than cash include stocks, bonds, annuities, property, and other assets.

Appreciated assets held more than one year, such as publicly traded stocks, mutual funds, bonds, real estate, collectibles, and other readily marketable property often provide tax advantages.

How do I give assets, such as stocks, bonds, and mutual funds?

- 1. Email the Cornerstone finance team (admin@cornerstonetulsa.org). They will provide you with transfer instructions.
- 2. Contact your broker and request the transfer. You will be provided with transfer papers to complete the transfer.
- 3. When you have completed the transfer, please notify the church office.

Personal property such as automobiles, jewelry, and other items may also be given. For personal assets with no tax consequences, you may find it easier to sell the asset and simply give the proceeds.

SPECIAL TAX-FREE IRA GIFTS

For those aged 70 ½ and older, it is possible to make tax-favorable charitable gifts from most types of IRA accounts. A total of up to \$100,000 per year can be transferred directly from IRAs to qualified charities, such as our church, free from federal income tax. There also may also be state income tax savings. For those 72 and older or those who have begun taking their Required Minimum Distribution (RMD), donations given in this way count toward their RMD for the year of the gift.

To take advantage of this benefit, it is important to make the donation directly from the IRA to the church. For those with check writing privileges on their accounts, this may be the most efficient way to make qualified charitable distributions from IRAs. Contact the church office or your tax advisor for more information.

HOW WILL YOU RESPOND?

We are inviting you to join the next phase of the adventure of following Jesus as the people of Cornerstone by partnering your faith and finances in our Building for the Future Project. We are kicking off a three year effort to fully fund the project and pay down the remaining debt.

To do this, we need your help. This simply will not happen without everyone playing their part.

Like the Israelites gathering resources for their sacred space, this will similarly take sacrificial generosity and faith from all of us. Not everyone will be able to give equal amounts, but everyone will be invited to prayerfully and creatively participate in the effort.

THREE REQUESTS OF YOU:

1) Will you prayerfully seek the Lord and ask what amount your family could sacrificially give toward this project (beyond your regular giving) over three years (2024, 2025, 2026)?

2) Will you plan to make your three-year pledge on (or before) a special commitment Sunday on May 5?

3) Will you consider front-loading your pledge as best as you are able?

As you seek the Lord about this decision, you may desire further dialogue with Jon (or other leaders). More conversation is welcomed.

Jon's pastor mentor Tom Harrison always affirmed the message of Scripture that "It is more blessed to give than to receive." Not only is it a blessing to be able to give; it's also a blessing to take part in practically supporting the work. May God give us the grace and courage and vision together to sacrificially give toward this opportunity to multiply kingdom outposts in Tulsa. Thank you in advance for your partnership!
